Let me take this special opportunity to greet you all whom have attended this ordinary council meeting in the name of our saviour Jesus Christ.

The year 2017 is almost over and a few weeks from today we will be going to a council recess, indeed there is one fact that we can never run away from and that this year has been extremely busy with numerous events, both politically and administratively oriented and all of those required our full attention.

13.1 INITIATION REPORT

Councillor J.B. Makaula presented an Initiation report which as follows:

The Eastern Cape's Summer Initiation season has already began and Provincial Authorities working with District and Local Municipalities are preparing to crack down on illegal initiation schools and unregistered Traditional Surgeons and schools.

The Eastern Cape Customary Male Initiation Practice Act will be enforced for the Second time this season after being signed into law in December.

In terms of the act, those who operate initiation schools without written permission from the MEC for Health and approval from their Local Traditional Leaders will be sentenced to a R20 000 fine and/or a year in jail.

And, if one of their initiates dies, operators could face 25 years in prison.

Provincial Health Spokesperson Sizwe Kupelo said authorities would concentrate their efforts in the OR Tambo and Alfred Nzo Districts, which are considered summer season hot spots.

The Department has set aside +-R13m for interventions that include leasing +-40 bakkies for 45 days of which 2 of them are within the Umzimvubu Local Municipality because of its vast area (KwaBhaca & eMaxesibeni).

Each will carry two medical officers with surgical supplies.

Interventions further include the provision of water to initiation huts and accommodation for teams monitoring initiation schools.

Several Doctors have also been contracted to assist.

We are creating space in hospitals in anticipation of overflows.

The new Act will be enforced for the second time and police will have to take it seriously and show no mercy in dealing with perpetrators.

Initiates, who have to be above the age of 18, should undergo mandatory medical pre-screening to identify and treat any pre-existing conditions.

The summer initiation season has already been launched by the Eastern Cape House of Traditional Leaders and the Department of Cooperative Governance and Traditional Affairs.


