FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF MONITORING AND MEASUREMENT PLAN FOR MOUNT FRERE AND MOUNT AYLIFF LANDFILL SITE OF UMZIMVUBU LOCAL MUNICIPALITY.

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1. BACKGROUND

There are two municipal landfill sites in Umzimvubu Local Municipality, the Mount Ayliff and Mount Frere landfill sites. Both are licensed under General communal landfill site; water balance negative in terms of the National Environmental Management: Waste Act, 2008 (Act 59 of 2008), as amended, (NEMWA).

Mount Ayliff landfill site

The Mount Ayliff landfill is located east of Mount Ayliff, approximately two kilometres off the N2 at 30°48'13.62"S, 29°23'9.79"E.

The facility covers an area of approximately 2.5 hectares. The facility is licensed as a G:C:B- landfill and may accept general waste. It is estimated that approximately 35 tonnes per day of waste is disposed. This is above the 25 tonnes daily limit set as the Maximum Rate of Deposition (MRD) for

communal landfill sites in the Minimum Requirements for Waste Disposal by Landfill, 2nd Edition (Department of Water Affairs and Forestry, 1998).

- □ 1 x weighbridge operator

Mount Frere landfill site

The Mount Frere landfill is located west of Mount Frere, approximately two and a half kilometres off the N2 at 30°53'20.93"S, 28°58'16.14"E.

The facility covers an area of approximately 8.5 hectares. The facility is licensed as a G:C:B- landfill and may accept general waste. It is estimated that approximately 40-45 tonnes per day of waste is disposed. This is above the 25 tonnes daily limit set as the Maximum Rate of Deposition (MRD) for communal landfill sites in the Minimum Requirements for Waste Disposal by Landfill, 2nd Edition (Department of Water Affairs and Forestry, 1998).

2. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Monitoring and measurement plan includes well and constituent lists, and summarizes sampling, analytical, and quality control requirements. This plan will be carried out on surface water, groundwater, odour, particulates, radiation, leachate, landfill gas. The purpose of this is to assess the performance of key landfill site infrastructure and to allow the early identification of any risk or unexpected performance that may lead to noncompliance with permit conditions.

2. LEGAL FRAMEWORK

Chapter five of the National Environmental Management: Waste Act, 2008 (Act 59 of 2008) provides for licensing waste management activities. License conditions are monitored and enforced to ensure environmental protection.

Mount Ayliff Landfill site license no 12/9/11/L46/1 clause 2.3 which states that the license holder must maintain and implement an emergency preparedness plan and review it annually when conducting audit and after each emergency and/or incident. Clause 6.1 states that the license holder must put in place a monitoring and measurement plan.

And

Mount Frere Landfill site license no 15/2/1/2/8D/22 clause 2.3 which states that the license license holder must maintain and implement an emergency preparedness plan and review it annually when conducting audit and after each emergency and/or incident. Clause 6.1 states that the license holder must put in place a monitoring and measurement plan. Which amongst other things, include the following:

- Tonnage received, reclaimed and/or landfilled.
- Surface and ground water quality monitoring.
- Compaction ratio monitoring.
- Biogas monitoring.
- Air space monitoring.
- Landfill site stability.

Clause 3.4 of The National Waste Management Strategy (NWMS) (04 May 2012) states that the purpose of licensing is to ensure that specific conditions regulate identified waste management activities (as currently listed47) that may have a detrimental effect on the environment.

Chapter three, regulation 8 (1) (c) of the National Environmental Management: Waste Act: Waste Classification & Management Regulations (R. 634 August 2013) states that the waste managers disposing of waste to landfill must only do so in accordance with the norms and standards for disposal of waste to landfill set in terms of section 7 (1) of the Act.

3. PROJECT OBJECTIVE

To develop landfill site monitoring and measurement plan in compliance with landfill permit requirements.

4. PROPOSED SCOPE OF WORKS

First and fore most the monitoring and measurement plan should demonstrate compliance with the compliance limits or requirements set in the permit. Furthermore, fulfil any additional monitoring and measurement requirements of the National Environmental Management: Waste Act, 2008 (Act 59 of 2008) and any other relevant legislation.

4.1. Landfill gas:

Monitoring of landfill gas is essential to ensure that the release of any landfill gas to the environment does not exceed the compliance limits as detailed in the Air Quality Management plan as adopted by the ULM Council. Proposed factors that should be taken into consideration when determining the site-specific landfill gas monitoring include:

- □ the age / status of the landfill
- the waste types landfilled
 the proximity of sensitive receptors
 the geological setting of the landfill
 the topography of the landfill
 the barriers and capping of the landfill
 Monitoring frequency.
 Monitoring constituents
 Monitoring points
 Tonnage received, reclaimed and/or landfilled.
 Air space monitoring
 Landfill site stability

4.2. Leachate and groundwater:

Monitoring of leachate and groundwater is essential to:

□ confirm that the depth of leachate accumulated at the base of the landfill does not exceed the permitted compliance limit.

□ monitor the generation and migration of leachate to groundwater to confirm groundwater or groundwater-dependent receptors are not impacted.

□ monitor the composition of leachate to facilitate effective management of treatment and / or disposal.

Proposed factors that should be taken into consideration when determining the site-specific leachate and groundwater monitoring and measurement plan include:

 $\hfill \Box$ the waste types landfilled.

- □ the geological setting of the landfill.
- □ the hydrogeological setting of the landfill.
- \hfill the topography of the landfill.
- □ the liner and leachate collection system of the landfill.
- $\hfill\square$ the proximity to surface water, groundwater and water-dependent receptors.
- 4.3 Surface water

To ensure that the facility will be protected from flooding, erosion by floodwaters and infiltration from perched water table.

 $\hfill\square$ the correct functioning of the leachate collection and treatment system.

□ that there are no 'breakouts' or 'run-off' from the landfill from unknown discharge points that are impacting surface water.

□ migration via a groundwater pathway is not adversely impacting surface water.

4.5 Drainage and surrounding land uses

To ensure and evaluates if drains that direct stormwater away from the areas where waste is to be landfilled and in place and properly managed. Furthermore, to ensure and evaluate if appropriate buffer distance is maintained between the landfill and sensitive land uses (receptors) to protect those receptors from any impacts resulting from a failure of landfill design or management or abnormal weather conditions. These failures might constitute discharge from the site of potentially explosive landfill gas, offensive odours, noise, litter and dust.

4.6 Occupational Health and safety

Due to tenuous working conditions and working accidents in the past, sufficient safety measures for the personnel in certain solid waste management facilities are deemed a necessity. Besides the fact that such facilities are equipped with heavy machinery associated with safety risks, the working environment poses additional health risks to the personnel, due to their exposure to various wastederived emissions. Therefore, it is required to establish and preserve the safety and hygienic conditions but also to equip and train their personnel during all waste treatment and management stages.

To ensure and evaluate the health and safety conditions in operating ULM Waste Management facilities.

4.7 Waste minimization

To ensure removal of recyclable materials from the waste stream.
