INTRODUCTION OF THE PROJECT

Umzimvubu Local Municipality has a legislative mandate to provide infrastructure, and quality services delivery in line with ULM Approved IDP to its residents amid other deliverables. This mandate inherently gives rise to uncertainties which translate into risks. It is not always efficient or possible to manage risks to zero residual risk or a very low residual risk threshold because of the time, cost and effort that will be required, and which could result in the cost-benefit dynamics to become skewed. On the other hand, it is also poor management practice to accept risks which create unnecessary exposure for the municipality.

Risk appetite is simply defined as the level of risk the municipality is willing to accept in the pursuit of its strategic objectives whilst risk tolerance is defined as amount of risk the municipality is prepared to bear above the risk appetite in pursuit of its strategic objectives. The concept of risk appetite and risk tolerance are often used interchangeably, but they have distinctly different meanings. Risk tolerance encompasses the broadest expression of risk an organization is willing to assume in executing its strategy. Risk appetite offers a pragmatic view of risk tolerance. On the other hand, risk bearing capacity is the capacity that the municipality must be able to absorb/deal with risks once they materialize. Risk bearing capacity is the ability to absorb additional risk-based volatility without detrimental effects/negative impact to key plans, strategies, operational and financial resources of the municipality.

Risk appetite and tolerance is a core consideration in embedding effective enterprise risk management approach and principles. The process will assist the municipality in meeting its mandate and expectations imposed by corporate governance standards, key stakeholders including the public. The framework will provide the basis to clearly state the general principles for the municipality's risk taking, raise risk awareness across the organization, and to guide the staff regarding acceptable and unacceptable behavior.

Therefore, the framework will help the municipality better manage and understand its risk exposure, make informed risk-based decisions, allocate resources, and understand risk/benefit trade- offs, and improve transparency for stakeholders and regulators.

To enable Umzimvubu Local Municipality to benefit from a well composed and structured risk appetite statement and tolerance levels, ULM seeks to obtain the services of suitably service provider to assist with developing a Comprehensive and tailored Risk Appetite, Tolerance, and Risk-Bearing Capacity Framework.
