Let me appeal to the house by saluting you all in this Special Council meeting in this summer bright morning. I think we are all fresh as South Africans that have passed the 300 years which we have been fighting for a constitutional democracy of which have been implemented since April 1994. It existence is derived on the laws and policies from the constitution of South Africa act no 108 of 1996. Quoting chapter 3 section 40 and 41 which defines our state that has three spheres of government — National, Provincial, Local, of which our area of competence is local sphere of government composed of communities, officials lead by the municipal manager, public representative which are Councillors.

Your worship, members of the Council and Managers, by powers invested upon me in terms of the prescript of the Republic of South Africa. I declare the Council officially open to take its mandate. Alfred Nzo West managed to achieve 74% & and Alfred Nzo East achieve 72 % which has a wide impact to the results in the province. Today there will be a meeting with Department of Education as Alfred Nzo West. Next week it will be Alfred Nzo West. The influence in Alfred Nzo is advancing. It is in the good picture of South Africa as a whole. We thus need to support Education for better attainment of results.

PURPOSE

To table a report on the Government Gazette No. 42134 on the remuneration of Public Office Bearers Act (20 of 1998) Determination Of upper limits of salaries, allowances and benefits of different members of Municipal Councils

To solicit endorsement by Council to write to the MEC for Local Government and/8 Traditional Affairs for his concurrence of Government Gazette No. 42134.

It was thereafter with Councillor S.A.N Cekeshe and Councillor N. Mdzinwa proposing and seconding respectively,

RESOLVED

- 1. That the report on the Government Gazette No. 42134 on the Determination of Upper Limits of Salaries, Allowances and Benefits of different Members of Municipal Councils is noted by the Council.
- That an across the board increase in salaries, allowances and benefits as stipulated in the Government Gazette No. 42134 on the Determination of Upper Limits of Salaries, Allowances and Benefits of different Members of Municipal Councils is approved by Council.
- That Council notes the increase will be effected retrospectively as from the 1 July 2018;
- 4. That Council notes that the cell phone package is an amount not exceeding R3 400 per month paid to all Councillors including Mayor and Speaker;
- 5. That the Council notes that use of data bundles allowance not exceeding R300 may be paid.
- 6. It is noted by Council that Councillors appointed to represent the Local Municipality in the District Municipality will receive an allowance of not more than R1 060.80 per day per sitting of the district Council or any committee of that Council;
- 7. That the Council approves that the current risk benefits to Councillors be taken by the municipality to provide for loss or damage to a Councillor's property, and assets excluding business property. The insurance will be limited to R1.5 million on residential property and on vehicles to R750 000.00.

- That the Council approves that the Municipality should have a budget towards Capacity Building initiatives for Umzimvubu Municipal Councillors;
- 9. That Council notes that an allowance of not more than R1 060.80 per sitting of governance structure per day will be paid to Councillors serving in those organised local government structures.:
- 10. That Council notes and approves that as per paragraph 2, 3 and 4 of the Gazette, the points calculated indicates that the municipality is Grade 3;
- 11. It is noted by Council that the municipality has budgeted accordingly for the increment of Councillors allowance;
- 12. That the Council notes the information required to be submitted to the MEC and Minister before 28 February 2019 as stipulated in Clause 18 of the Gazette and approves that it is submitted by Mayor.
- 13. That the Council notes and approves that there should be consultation with the MEC for Cooperative Governance & Traditional Affairs with regard to implementation of the Government Gazette before the increase and back pay is processed.
