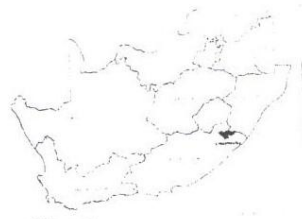

The Food For Waste intervention is in its third year of operation in the Umzimvubu Local Municipality and services were first rendered in November 2009.

Household waste is collected twice a week approximately 5,000 households are serviced in Mount Ailiff and 1,500 in Mount Frere. On the third day, public cleansing in Mount Ailiff takes place along Solis Street, Mt. Ailiff and the new residential area of Mt. Ailiff to be built.

In Mount Frere, this happens in the open space between Eskom and Alfred Ndzo District Municipality offices, along the N2, between Lubalasi location and the Engen garage, around the Mount Ailiff Sawmill, and the municipal playgrounds.

Women have benefited a great deal from this programme, as 86 of 100 beneficiaries are women. The beneficiaries receive their food parcels on the last Friday of each month.

1,410 bags of litter were collected in Mount Ailiff in November 2010 during the cleanup campaign.

The food parcels are delivered at the Mount Ailiff and Mount Frere municipal halls respectively. The municipality, in conjunction with the Alfred Nzo District Municipality, is keen to support recycling and is planning to establish a buy-back centre to facilitate the recovery of recycling materials, which will support the Food For Waste's waste minimisation goal. In addition to awareness-raising workshops with communities, ten anti-dumping signboards have been erected in the municipality.
